EDITORIAL - What Are You Doing About It?

News. So much news bombards our senses every day. Hourly news broadcasts on the radio, television news, internet feeds, newspapers and even word of mouth, all vie for our attention. And then there is the Ecclesial News.

I am a bit of news addict. I like knowing what is going on – especially when it comes to news about the people I love in the body of Christ. For that reason I have always looked forward to regular issues of the Ecclesial News.

In the survey we are running at the moment, it appears that the most popular part of the Ecclesial News is the section summarising births, deaths, baptisms, engagements and marriages, followed closely by news from ecclesias we know. They have been my favourite bits too, and it seems like it has always been that way.

Even before the Ecclesial News began, people were sending news back and forth between ecclesias and from the mission field. Paul told the Ephesians, "So that you also may know how I am and what I am doing, Tychicus the beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord will tell you everything. I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are, and that he may encourage your hearts" (Ephesians 6:21 – 22 ESV).

While it is all very interesting to hear the news, the big question is, what are we going to do about it? When news came to Nehemiah about the trouble and disgrace the Jews were facing in Jerusalem, he did something about it. Because he was in Susa, he couldn't physically help in any way – but he could pray. And that's exactly what Nehemiah did. He prayed. Because of his prayer, God used Nehemiah to build up the walls of Jerusalem and the people within the city.

When Paul sent his news to the Ephesians, he also told them to keep "praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication... and also for me" (Ephesians 6:18,19).

Let's do the same. As we read through this issue of the Ecclesial News, let's read it with a heart of prayer. There are all sorts of prayers that can flow from the news you are about to read: thanks for births and baptisms; thanks for lives that have been lived and the hope of the resurrection; prayers for those who are mourning; prayers for relationships that are growing; prayers for ecclesias and the people in them; and asking for blessings on the preaching and events that are coming up, to name a few.

The Ecclesial News is not just here to inform. It is also a pointer to pray.

Let's be like Paul who heard news about his brothers and sisters and gave thanks. He said, "We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing" (2 Thessalonians 1:3).

He also prayed for them. "And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God." (Philippians 1:9 – 11).

So as we read this issue of the Ecclesial News, let us pray.



Wee baby Freya Green had to have an operation recently as well.





AUSTRALASIAN YOUTH CONFERENCE 2025 (NZYC)



In April this year the 38th Australasian Christadelphian Youth Conference was held in Matamata, New Zealand (NZYC 2025). The Australasian Youth Conferences are held in New Zealand every 10 years, so it was a particularly special week for the Christadelphian community in New Zealand. It was wonderful to be part of likely the largest gathering of Christadelphians ever to be held in New Zealand to date.

The Australasian Youth Conferences have a legacy of encouraging, inspiring and edifying young people on their path to God's kingdom and are a chance to hear the word expounded;

to personally study and discuss with others; and to develop friendships based on a common hope. We are thankful to our Heavenly Father who enabled this life-changing experience for so many young people.

We would also like to thank the Ecclesias across Australasia for their support of the Conference. We know you have contributed in so many ways, with prayers, time, finances, resources, and enabling and encouraging your young people to attend. We would encourage you to talk to the young people in your Ecclesia about their Conference week, the friendships they made, and the lessons they learned.

The topic for the Conference was 1st Timothy. This letter is full of practical encouragement to a young man and has a timeless message on how to live a godly way of life in an ungodly world. It also contains wonderful advice on ecclesial life in the face of a growing apostacy. The theme for Conference was 'Keep the Charge' taken from Paul's repeated words to Timothy. The call is for us all to keep that charge and to uphold a spirit of godliness ourselves.

The main focus of the Conference programme was the discussion groups each morning. It was wonderful to hear the young people discussing the principles and wisdom found in Paul's letter, and how it might apply to their own lives. Afterwards Brother Nathan Lewis held short wrap-up studies to pull together the key themes from the section discussed, and gave everyone the same final takeaway points. These studies were a highlight of the week as he clearly explained principles and showed us all some positive and practical lessons.

The evening sessions were a mix of activities and studies. The activities included a moving play following the life of Timothy and Paul; an agora themed evening with market stalls; a quiz to get our brains buzzing; and a beautiful evening of song and praise. We were joined by Brother Mark O'Grady for a two-part evening series on godliness, providing an excellent principles overview of the of God manifestation and inspiring the young people to commit to lives of godly service.

There were a number of other highlights during the week including a Kiwiana games afternoon, electives and waterslides. There was also an epic day trip – we loaded all 400 young people onto buses and headed to Rotorua's incredible Waiotapu geothermal park, then to the luge for an afternoon of adrenaline. The views from the gondola were beautiful, especially as the sun began to set across the lake. After a dinner at the luge, 400 tired but happy young people made their way back to Conference for a special supper evening.

After the week concluded there were 100 attendees who also attended Post Conference. This group did a road trip down the North Island to Wellington, enjoying the sights and adventures of New Zealand. Once in Wellington they were billeted to families and continued with activities in the Capital. In the evenings Brother Ben Brinkerhoff led a series on Unity in Ephesus – a perfect follow-on from Conference. The young people learnt so many lessons about how to live in unity with each other, replicating Christ to our brethren.

NZYC 2025 was an inspiring and encouraging week. It is our prayer that we all take Paul's charge to Timothy to heart, striving together for lives of godliness until our Lord appears from heaven. We were so richly blessed by our Heavenly Father. We praise and glorify Him for the wonderful opportunity He provided.

62 sisters in Christ, both youthful and seasoned in wisdom, gathered from near and far for a spiritually enriching weekend in the peaceful village of Methven. Amid joyful conversations and heartfelt catch-ups, we dove deeply into God's Word, led by Jackie Grieve and Rachelle Oosthuizen.

Rachelle turned our hearts toward God's overwhelming generosity, helping us reflect on what it truly means to live an abundant life in Him. Jackie shared powerful insights on God's forgiveness, drawing from Scripture and

equipping us with practical tools to walk the often difficult road of forgiving others.

Between sessions, we shared in early morning meditations, scenic walks, local explorations, and peaceful moments soaking in the hot pools.

The weekend was a beautiful success—made possible by the grace of our Heavenly Father—leaving each of us renewed, uplifted, and ready to step back into daily life with hearts spiritually refreshed.

WHAT'S COOKING IN CAMBODIA?

A \$3 Beef Lok Lak if it were me visiting the local restaurant, one minute from the Bible Education Centre. The BEC in Phnom Penh is the central hub of the Cambodian mission field. With its meeting space, outdoor hangout areas, plentiful accommodation and abundant air-con, people from all over the city and globe are popping in regularly. Currently, Sophie Emerson (Wellington/Adelaide) and Jonny David (Madurai/India) are on the ground spreading the good news but there is plenty of demand for more workers!

The work is diverse but the most common task is teaching the Bible in simple English to university students. Many of the them are from the two dormitories operated by the mission, a boy's and a girl's dorm, about five minutes from the BEC. Group classes are held each evening, from which many students choose to go on to separate classes – often inviting their friends from university to join them. Twice a week Thavan (the local manager and Sophie's fiancé) takes the tuk-tuk to another dormitory, an hour out of town, where we have been

teaching a group of about 20 teenagers who are interested to learn the morals found in the Bible.

Other tasks are focused on the longevity of the Currently Arranging Cambodian ecclesia. Brethren are being formed so they are a step closer to autonomy, but the need for fieldworker support is still strong as we have many projects under way. The Farm, based about two hours from the city has been very well established and there are many different crops such as dates, coconuts, mangos and livestock such as cows and pigs. There is a BEC up in Siem Riep that is ready to be used as a base for a young family who would like to support the work up in one of the coolest cities in the world. A BEC has been constructed down in Sihanoukville (Beach city) and John and Janet Harrison (NZ/Australia) are arriving soon to support the work there.

Cambodia has proved to be an excellent country for our brothers and sisters escaping dangerous situations abroad. Our mission field

> is currently being used as a city of refuge. This has helped us to secure a guardian family who stay at the BEC looking after fieldworkers and organising worship. music and refugees have safely made it to Australia through Cambodia with the help of the Fieldworkers and Christadelphian support. Brother Arian (17) who came over with his mother, father and brother was baptised during Easter and is now heavily involved in activities at the BEC in Phnom Penh.

Trapaeng Prasat Meeting Structure

Probably the most exciting work happening is the formation of a new ecclesia in Trapaeng Prasat. Located north of Siem Reap near the Thai border, TP has a large group of young families who are extremely interested in the Truth. Brother Sophorn, who studied in the Dorms has been spreading the gospel up there for about a decade. The community there has built a structure (see picture) that we can use for truth camps and seminars. They are an enthusiastic bunch who love to play group games and belt out Khmer hymns. A truth camp is being held this month but more fieldworkers are needed in order to meet the demand for Bible teaching in Trapaeng Prasat. The most exciting thing about this forming ecclesia is the fact that Sophorn (Bearer of many nicknames including 'The Angel') independently began preaching and bringing the group together.

There is always a demand for fieldworkers in Cambodia. It is one of the best countries in which to do mission work due to the welcoming locals, low cost of living, delicious cuisine and access to western products and services. There are great support networks thanks to ACBM, WCF and AinA. Riding around in tuk-tuks and motos is also a hoot, and if you want to borrow my XR250 while I'm not there we can work something out:D

conference, enjoying and wholesome some very fellowship. I also spent a day at the Bible Education Centre and gave some talks there. It is frequented by many high and school university it students. as is very conveniently located between a school and a uni.

While we were in Cebu, we did some leafletting and advertising for two seminars at a local fast-food restaurant (Jollibee, for those in the know). The haul from off the

street was 56 interested friends and about another 30 from the ecclesia including us. Seeing them all actively paying attention, taking notes, asking questions, and genuinely interested in what the speakers were saying, was so encouraging.

Friendships were strengthened, spiritual food consumed, faith increased. As always, I left having received so much more than what I gave. And now I leave again with a piece of my heart over there for all my ecclesial family.

I encourage all those thinking about mission work to visit the Philippines. You will not regret it, and just maybe you'll find you'll have to keep going back too.

I am very grateful for the generosity of the ACBM NZ committee and the Missionary Support Fund for assisting with this trip.



TONGA MISSION TRIP



We're excited to share this update from our April trip to Tonga.

Last year in October we were blessed to go to Tonga with Zak and Abi Read, Aaron and Lydia Middlemiss, Ty Hillian and Shem Carrol (Aus), along with about 15 youth from Wellington and Hawke's Bay. The trip was a great success on many levels, allowing a fantastic opportunity for our youth to help other youth, and the rest of the small ecclesia in many practical and spiritual ways.

A lot of the trip involved setting up the Mission House in Tonga. This has provided a base for the small ecclesia and visitors to welcome friends and have fellowship. Previously, the meeting was held under the mango tree where Sisters Kalo, Valerie and Brother Ralph lived. As idyllic as that was, it wasn't very weather proof!

Brother Manase had offered to oversee the Mission House, and was to be based there along with his 3 children Nathan (18), Hadasseh (16) and Laiseni (14). Sister Talita is

based in Lismore, Australia where she works to help the family.

As many of you will know, Brother Manase unexpectedly passed away not long after we had been there. It was a great shock to everyone near and far.

Warren and Sheryn Shapcott were a great support, at the time of Manase's passing, attending and officiating the funeral. Zak and Abi Read and Ty Hillian (AUS) also provided invaluable support.

This year in April, we were determined, by the grace of God, to get back to Tonga to support our family in Christ as much as possible. Our immediate family (Wynton, Rachel, Shiloh, Zion and Eden) were all able to go, along with two invaluable volunteers from Australia, Ari and Jordana Burley (Matt and Leah Burley's kids). In a lovely twist of providence, Talita (Manase's widow) belongs to the same ecclesia as the Burleys, so Ari and Jordy know her well.





Also, by God's grace and foresight, Ari's plumbing skills were exactly what was needed this visit, as there were significant issues with the plumbing. While the Mission House is rented, often it's more efficient in Tonga to fix it yourself, and generates more good will as well. Ari's skills were definitely tested as it sometimes felt like plugging a sinking boat! But Tongan/Kiwi/Aussie ingenuity and determination prevailed ... for the most part.

One of the main goals of the trip was to provide pastoral care for the youth living at the Mission House. This largely came from our youth getting alongside the Tongan youth, sharing real life help. Some highlights were:

- Ari teaching Nathan to weld and use building tools
- Eden doing a cooking class
- Zion sharing breathing exercises and stress management techniques
- Jordy and Shiloh teaching cards games and singing.

It should be noted that Ari was able to do significant fundraising in the Australian CYCs, which enabled him to purchase basic building tools to leave at the Mission House for other volunteers to use.

The Tongan youth love to come and stay at the Mission House while anyone visits, which boosted our travelling gang to about 12 to 15 people for most of the trip. We hired a flatbed truck to be able to transport everyone, with the highlight being praise and worship songs blaring while everyone sang along!

Each day we would aim to help at the Mission house, do outreach of some sort, have a welcome wharf jumping session or beach visit, and finish sharing a meal with the ecclesia and Bible study.

Outreach could be delivering sandwiches in poorer areas, reconnecting with the local women's centre to give donated hygiene packs, getting to know the local community etc.

There is so much that can be done to help our spiritual family in Tonga by just being there with them. Fellowship, for a small group of believers, is invaluable. If anyone is thinking of visiting, please do it! Your help will be greatly appreciated and your own faith journey benefit enormously.

Of course there are some challenging times (like loss of power and water, and breakdowns etc) but God will use your gifts, if you allow him too, often in unexpected ways. His spirit is at work in Tonga and in all of us.






