EDITORIAL - Southland Hospitality

This issue of the Ecclesial News is coming to you from New Zealand's Deep South where Sharon and I are sojourning for three months. As far as I know, this is the first issue of the Ecclesial News that has been produced in the South Island, let alone as far south as Invercargill.

It has been an amazing blessing to have had the opportunity to travel from Auckland to Invercargill and to be welcomed into the Southland ecclesias like family.

One of the things we have most enjoyed about Southland is discovering that the legend of Southland hospitality is a very real thing. Only days after we arrived, we were welcomed to a shared Sunday lunch in Invercargill, and the following weekend were included in a 'Come Dine with Me' afternoon where the members of the Riverton ecclesia were either hosting or hosted by each other for Sunday lunch. We enjoyed wonderful fellowship and conversations on both occasions. As well as those first two memorable Sundays, we have had numerous invitations out, experienced the legendary Riverton Bible class suppers, met people for coffee, walks, bonfires, dinners and been so engrossed in talking to people that we have almost had to lock up the ecclesial halls all by ourselves!

Southland hospitality can be shown anywhere. We are told to "practice hospitality" (Romans 12:13 NIV). The word practice means to put something into action rather than only learning theories about it. It means to do something repeatedly to improve skill. And yet another meaning is the usual way of doing something. With these meanings of practice in mind, hospitality should be something that is seen from us on a very regular basis.

Hospitality is the friendly and generous treatment of friends and strangers. That could mean anything from a greeting or a chat, to sharing a full threecourse meal or having a family to stay for a month. We can all be hospitable in some way – and food is a great help.

Even if showing hospitality seems unnatural or awkward, we can improve and grow with practice. The more we practice hospitality, the better we will get at it.

The scriptures also say to "Show hospitality to one another without grumbling" (1 Peter 4:9 ESV). Yes, showing hospitality can seem like hard work, but the payoff for our hard work is huge. I remember one time when we grumbled about being asked to host people we had never even met, but our guests turned out to be such an inspiration to us that we will never forget them. Maybe we entertained angels without knowing it!

Travel is more limited in the middle of winter, so now is the time to practice hospitality in a smaller way within our own ecclesias and communities. But as the weather warms up and travel resumes once again, let's show our hospitality to the other people who come our way as well.

Many of our ecclesial reports in this issue of the Ecclesial News have lists of visitors, which just goes to show the spirit of unity and hospitality we share. So let's make each other very welcome in our conversation, in our homes, with food and in our prayers.

No matter where we are, from Cape Reinga to Bluff or anywhere in between, the fellowship we have in New Zealand as united brothers and sisters in Christ is unique because we are family.

Sorry Southland, but I propose we move the legend on from *Southland Hospitality* to *Kiwi Hospitality*.




Family Matters





What a wonderful opportunity we had recently come together for the Christadelphian Winter Family Bible School! Brothers, sisters, young people and families from various areas of New Zealand, Australia and Tonga gathered in Napier NZ, for a refreshing week of fellowship and learning together. What a joyfilled experience as we were educated, inspired and empowered by God's word, and encouraged by the love of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Throughout the week together, Bro Con Mitsos (AU) and Bro Jacob Lewis (NZ) led us in inspiring studies each morning.

Bro Con shared insightful lessons from

Hezekiah, King of Judah, presenting him as a type of the Lord Jesus Christ and drawing valuable spiritual lessons from his faith, zeal, and leadership. As we explored the details of Hezekiah's life and his efforts to reform the nation, Bro Con challenged us to reflect on how Hezekiah's commitment to restoring godly principles and true worship in a time of spiritual drought could inspire transformation in our own lives today.

INDIA MISSION TRIP



India Bangalore Bible Week

In May this year, ten of us were blessed with the opportunity of visiting India for roughly two and a half weeks, lead by Bro Malcolm and Sis Suhasini Scott. There were roughly 170 people who attended the Bible school, however many came and went as they were able, due to work/school etc. There were two main speakers for the school – Bro Renay Meulen (Australia) on the topic "Life in the Kingdom", and Bro Malcolm Scott on the topic "The mind of Christ". After each talk, we broke into discussion groups which provided opportunity to discuss what the speakers covered and ask questions. The thirst the local brothers and sisters have for God's word was very encouraging for us. Many of them had travelled a long way from their towns and villages to attend, and they were all very happy and appreciative to be there

If you were able to go back to the past to change a moment in your life, would you, and what would it be? Or perhaps, what wisdom would you tell your younger self if you could?

Over King's Birthday weekend Bro Hayden unlocked for us the **book of Deuteronomy** – a re-delivery of the Law by Moses to the nation's youth as they stood on the outskirts of their new inheritance. We learned how Moses' inspired words of wisdom and encouragement to his people are just as relevant for us today, as we stand at the brink of our Promised Land.

"Everything that was written in the past can teach us, and the encouragement the scriptures provide can give us hope." Romans15:4 We spent the long weekend together and were well reminded how important it is to use the words from scripture (wisdom and lessons from the past) to teach, encourage, inform, and transform our lives now.

We were nourished with five full talks; HOPE FOR A GENERATION – where it was rather eye-opening when Hayden asked only the under 20-year-olds to stand in the room. Starkly illustrating how the older generation was to die out (Num 32:11), leaving just the youngies to enter the land. This is the group Moses was talking to. We looked at OBEDIENCE AND DISCIPLINE – staying faithful, but also the provision of forgiveness,

hope and a way back if we mess up; MAKING THE DIFFERENCE – the traits of good leaders and a call to follow fully and with courage (as Caleb did); THE POWER OF LOVE – love occurs a whopping 24x in Deuteronomy, a sharp increase compared to its contemporary books, here the law is re-given, heavily seasoned with a focus on love and the attitude of our hearts; and finishing with a (ball, I mean) call, to **Follow**, to **Obey**, to live with **Hope** and **Love** – to be LIVING WITH PURPOSE.

Alongside Hayden's encouraging and challenging content:

- we enjoyed bringing together new and old friends over casual and slightly messy ice breaker games;
- we incited competition with a quiz, press-up challenges and chocolate;
- there was some downtime spent at the hosts before a few frosty hours ice skating, with only one sliced finger and one agitated shoulder to report;
- morning teas, suppers and three shared lunches allowed plenty of opportunity for fellowship over yummy food and delicious company;
- the swimming pool was swam in, hydro-slide slid down, and inflatable obstacle course overcome;

- the annual oldies vs youngies football match brought the weekend to its traditional close.


